- The 2023 Calibre Essay Prize Runner-Up We publish Bridget Vincent's 'Child Adjacent', a moving personal exploration of what being an 'Aunt of the Anthropocene' might entail and the ways in which climate change influences how we engage with the children in our lives and the stories we tell them.
- Robyn Archer takes ABR Backstage In the first of our new Arts interview series, ABR Laureate and arts legend Robyn Archer takes us behind the scenes and reveals some of her favourite and most formative performances. Archer also reflects on the challenges facing artists in Australia and the single biggest thing that governments could do for artists.
- Mark Kenny on Labor's first year in office Australian National University Professor and politics podcaster Mark Kenny analyses the Albanese government's first twelve months in power and considers what the next two years may look like for the government, and for an Opposition led by Peter Dutton.
- John Zubrzycki on Narendra Modi's India ABR launches a series of informed commentaries about our region with the support of Peter McMullin and The Good Business Foundation with the publication of John Zubrzycki's article on India's new strategic approach to international relations and self-definition.
