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Rowan Heath wins the 2023 Jolley Prize

Rowan Heath is the winner of the 2023 ABR Elizabeth Jolley Short Story Prize. They receive \$6,000 for their story 'The Mannequin'. Heath was announced as the winner of the Jolley Prize by judge Maria Takolander at a Zoom ceremony on 17 August, which featured readings by all three shortlisted authors.

Judges' Comments

'In "The Mannequin", a solitary truck driver, who fossicks for valuables in junkyards, finds a dumped store mannequin outside a roadhouse. The mannequin becomes an ambiguous companion on his journey, provoking troubling memories of his ex-wife and estranged children, reminding him of what has been lost through his intransigence, while simultaneously suggesting the liberating possibility of transformation. A superbly controlled and nuanced story, "The Mannequin" is a haunting exploration of the mysteriousness at the heart of ourselves.'

Jolley Prize Shortlist and Judges

The other two shortlisted authors are: **Uzma Aslam Khan** (United States), runner-up for her story 'Our Own Fantastic' and **Winter Bel** (France/United Kingdom), placed third for her story 'Black Wax'. <u>All three stories appear in the August issue</u>.

This year the ABR Elizabeth Jolley Short Story Prize (worth a total of \$12,500) received 1,200 entries from thirty-eight different countries. It was judged by **Gregory Day, Jennifer Mills and Maria Takolander.**
