Marguerite Johnson is the *ABR* Gender Fellow. Her project is titled 'Mapping Gender, Sexuality and the Environment: *Picnic at Hanging Rock* Fifty Years On'. *ABR* will publish her Fellowship article later in 2017. Dr Johnson receives \$7,500 from *ABR*.

Marguerite Johnson has commented: 'Arguably, there is no novel like Joan Lindsay's *Picnic at Hanging Rock* when it comes to mapping Australia's gender, sexuality and environmental histories. Unlike Miranda, it simply refuses to remain lost in the vastness of Victoria's Macedon Ranges. On the fiftieth anniversary of Lindsay's novel, it is timely to review and reassess it.'
